Here if You Need Me is the story of Kate Braestrup's remarkable journey from grief to faith to happiness. It is dramatic, funny, deeply moving, and simply

unforgettable, an uplifting account about finding God through helping others, and the tale of the small miracles that occur every day when life and love are restored. While keeping physically fit and achieving expert law enforcement skills are essential to a successful police officer, maintaining a strong heart, mind, and soul are also crucial to surviving in his or her career. This new edition of this singular book serves as a tool to help law enforcement officers consciously take the pulse of their soul, ensuring that they stay on a strong spiritual and moral path. The book is not just a collection of devotions with religious meaning, but rather it clearly identifies some of the most trying situations that officers often find themselves in and helps them make sense of it all. The author then links these situations with relevant biblical passages. Each devotion in the book is freestanding and can be used in any order. The devotions and corresponding situations are presented in five categories: Justice, Dealing with People, Crime and Police Situations, Prevention, and Self-Care. Each of the 69 devotion sections concludes with questions for reflection and a meaningful prayer. The revision of the text includes 15 percent more devotions, and the Appendix of Prayers for Law Enforcement Situations has been increased from two to 22 prayers. These address a wide variety of ceremonial functions, including cadet graduations, retirements, blessings for substations, and award banquets. Also new is a guide for offering prayers for Fire Department events. This unique book is designed not only for the individual police officer, but firefighters, law enforcement supervisors, community service officers, chaplains, and ministers as well. Dramatic stories from the line of duty depict real life struggles faced by police and first responders when sirens scream and lives are changed forever. When this project began the Police Chaplains of the Asheville Police Department, Asheville, North Carolina had been attempting to address the needs of personnel without a clearly defined focus of need in mind. This project sought to determine in an objective manner priorities of ministry. A survey was taken of the Chaplains and the Department's employees, the data analyzed, and the findings became the basis for revising the regulations governing the chaplaincy program. The survey revealed the service most desired by personnel was that of making death notifications. Chaplains received further training and a uniform procedure for answering these calls was defined and adopted. Other priorities listed represented situations wherein the officer's professional expertise may be seriously challenged. Survey results clearly demonstrate the sense of need felt by officers for the chaplain's ministry. Chaplains are wanted most in circumstances in which officers sense their need for a power greater than themselves. The chaplain symbolizes that power and in those moments can be a visible reminder of the presence and love of an almighty God. The most remarkable discovery made in the project was the amazing degree of receptivity to the program. Only two persons of a total of 122 respondents indicated a very negative opinion; four indicated they believed the program was not generally

effective. It would appear that any law enforcement agency considering a chaplaincy program would be advised to give thoughtful consideration to the findings. As results were studied by the Chaplains Corps the challenge to sustain the high degree of confidence placed in the program was recognized and a commitment to insure equally positive results in the future. Within these pages you will find tools you can use to work with law enforcement in a ministry role. This book can be used as a "how to" guide for chaplains. It details out how to really make a difference in your community in times of crisis; and how to come alongside law enforcement in such a way as to be an asset to them. What is it like to kill another human being? God, I pray I never know! However, every armed citizen needs to contemplate this question. The movies we watch, the games we play, the books we read, the music we listen to and even the training we practice have all played a part in desensitizing how we think about killing. In reality, killing in self-defense or in defense of others is an up-close and personally traumatic experience. Killing another human being is a real possibility that must be addressed by those who carry a firearm for self-defense and defense of others. While the vast majority of armed citizens enjoy lifelong carrying with no incidents that result in killing, the reality is that many do and all must face this possibility. With the exception of two additional chapters,

this book is a rewrite of the popular book *Killing: A Spiritual Discernment Guide for Law Enforcement*. It was written primarily for law enforcement officers, but most of what is found in that book is also applicable to responsibly armed citizens. Law enforcement officers and armed citizens have some similar responsibilities. This book highlights the importance of being prepared and working through the spiritual aspects or belief system issues associated with the possibility of having to end the life of another human being. Subtitle *My Journey from Being a Minister of Grace to an Enforcer of the Law* This book is written primarily with law enforcement officers in mind. However, most of what is written is also of significant importance for any citizen who is regularly armed with any type of deadly weapon for the purposes of self-defense and/or defense of others. The topic of this book is a spiritual discernment on killing. More specifically, it highlights the importance of being prepared and working through the spiritual aspects or belief system issues associated with the possibility of having to end the life of another human being. This manual for law enforcement funerals addresses preparation for the funeral, basic elements of the funeral, types of funerals, memorial services for a departmental animal who dies under various circumstances, and funeral resources. In providing guidelines for funeral preparation, the first chapter focuses on procedures for death notifications and the role of the police chaplain in departmental funerals. The second chapter outlines the basic elements of the law enforcement funeral. These include religious inclusiveness and sensitivity at the funeral; special religious funeral considerations (Buddhist, Hindu, Islamic, Jewish, and Roman Catholic, Orthodox Catholic, Lutheran, and Anglican); general information on law enforcement funerals; elements of the funeral; and funeral arrangements for members killed in the line of duty. The third chapter considers the following types of funerals: funeral for a member killed in the line of duty, funeral for an active member who died off-duty, and funeral for a retired member. After discussing the rationale for departmental animal memorial services, the fourth chapter offers suggestions for a memorial for an animal killed in the line of duty and animals who die while off-duty or in retirement. The concluding chapter provides the following types of funeral resources: poems and short readings, police hymns, prayers, survivor resources, and support agencies and resources. 39 notes, a subject index, and appended sample line-of-duty death departmental regulation or standard operating procedures and model departmental policy, funeral checklist, and personnel debriefings. This third edition manual is intended to provide law enforcement agencies with a quick and informative reference when the worst occurs: the unexpected death of a departmental member. The material contained herein has been gathered by the International Conference of Police Chaplains from numerous departments and sources.
